Tokyo has the advantage of allowing us to be near a huge market where the voices of consumers can be heard close at hand. Here, we can gain an understanding of consumer tastes regarding the size of vegetables and preferred packaging and reflect these immediately in production. Another advantage is that cultivation techniques and agricultural materials can be introduced more quickly than in rural areas. Currently we are raising four types of vegetables, mizuna (potherb mustard), small turnips, spinach, and carrots, on nine hectares of land. The mission of farmers is to keep on growing the food that feeds the populace. To ensure a stable supply, I believe it necessary to make concerted efforts with nearby farmers.
